From the Desk of the Pastor:

My Dear Friends in Christ,

Today, we celebrate the Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel Theme for today: We hear the story of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes, truly a miracle, showing us how Jesus Christ still does great things for us today. The words of Scripture are fulfilled in Him: The hand of the Lord feeds us: He answers all of our needs. God satisfies our hunger with the banquet of life, with the love of Christ, with the strength of His Covenant. How great and good is He; how rich, His mercy. All who are thirsty, come to the river of life.

1st Reading: God is calling us to share His banquet. We are about to receive His invitation to that special Feast! He says, "All you who are thirsty.... You who have no money... Come, without paying and without cost...." 2nd Reading: Our experience of God's love continues in the Mass. Nothing can destroy the friendship that is a part of our lives. He assures us that nothing, absolutely nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

The Liturgical Seasons are so very important to us. In Ordinary Time, we are to make the Ordinary, Extraordinary, and in Extraordinary Time, we are to make the Extraordinary, believable. What God has to offer is free. God's forgiveness is free, His Grace is free. At the multiplication of the loaves and fish, an allusion to the Eucharist, Jesus blessed, broke and gave to the disciples, and the disciples in turn, gave to others. What God gives us is so satisfying.....

"Great God and Father, we praise you and bless you. We thank you for the wonder of your love. Hear our prayers and help us to love you in return, through Christ our Lord, Amen!"

Our special thanks to Joseph Campbell, Sara Duris, David Simaz and George Sparke for also stepping forward to run for this position.

#4. Parish Improvements this summer: We are now in the midst of a number of projects and improvements during the remainder of this summer season. Just completed is the new carpeting for the foyer and stairwells at St. John's Church. Currently in progress is a new roof for the Loft building. We will also be installing new curb and sidewalks around the Convent area, as well as new retaining walls around St. John's Church and the adjoining Rectory complex. All of these projects are long overdue and will be a part of the 2008/2009 budget. Please see the enclosed Parish Council minutes for other projects and activities being considered. A summary of the 2007/2008 year-end budget as well as the just completed 2008/2009 budget will appear on the back of your Sunday bulletin shortly.

JULY 2, 2008**

OPENING PRAYER: Fr. Bill opened the meeting with a prayer at 6:18 p.m..

ROLL CALL: Present: Fr. Bill Jacobs, Nancy Johns, Bill Shine, Mary Ann Hinz, Ed Nickel and John Grover.
Excused: Tom Strzyzkowski. Absent Dan Fitzgerald

Minutes of April 8, 2008 meeting were accepted as printed.

CHANGES IN MEMBERSHIP: Ed Nickel and Nancy Johns' terms on the board are expired. Nancy Johns is eligible for re-election and has elected to do so. Ed Nickel is ex-officio on the board. There have been resumes received from Sara Duris, Joe Campbell, George Sparke, Allen Zenka, David Simaz. The election to fill the vacant seat will be held in July.

OLD BUSINESS:

- a) New Parishioners - the Women's Ministry hosted the welcome banquet which had 150-160 persons in attendance. Welcome gift bags were given to each family and child. Don and Linda Wallenfang prepared a special presentation of Ss John & Bernard's activities and ministries.
- b) First Communion - Very successful - 50 children received their first communion on Sunday afternoon to a packed house. The Women's Ministry hosted the reception.
- c) Parish picnic - Sunday, Sept. 14, 2008 at St. Bernard's. Same committee as last year.
- d) Confirmation - there will be a combined St. Joseph, and Ss John & Bernard's ceremony on October 5, 2008 at LMC elementary school.
- e) Cemetery - Columbarium - will be available in July.
- f) Church Directory - directory is at the printers and will be available for pick up at Masses hopefully by the end of July.
- g) Loft - Y MCA has moved out and building is undergoing some repairs to the roof and windows.
- h) Pews at St. B's - the Knights of Columbus are helping orchestrate a plan for new pews.

NEW BUSINESS:

- a) Convent - repairs are in process and sidewalks around the convent will be replaced.
- b) Church/Rectorry grounds - the retaining wall needs repair and will be replaced.
- c) Loft - windows and roof will be replaced.
- d) Nursery supervision - a proposal has been made to provide paid supervisory person (s) at the 9 & 11 Masses for the nursery. Council will continue to study this.
- e) Parish nurse: Nancy Johns suggested we look into what a parish nurse could do for our church.. Discussion held and it was decided that we have a presentation at the next Board meeting of what the ministry is and what our responsibilities will be.
- f) It was suggested that St. B's landscaping in front be updated and freshened up.

PASTOR'S REPORT:

- a) LMC - Fr. Bill reported that enrollment is steady.
- b) KDSA - we are the best in the diocese with more than \$24,000 over and are still working on completing the remaining cards.
- c) 2007/2008 Budget - a full report will appear in the Sunday bulletin.

Meeting adjourned at 7:12 p.m. Next meeting to be announced in Fall 2008.
